Center her entire life (her front door is 100 feet from ours!) She is funny, extremely helpful - when she wants to be - but guarded. Living with her at home are her mom and two older brothers. Mom works long days to provide for her children, but that often leaves them home alone.

Growing up on Sayonara Drive is hard. At a young age kids are exposed to things they should never see. Jessica has known three people on her street who have been murdered; she fairly often sees drug deals; and she's seen apartments raided by the police.

But there is also the good. Living directly across the street, she has been a part of the Sayonara Center even before being able to participate as a student. She has adults who care about her and check in on how she is doing. She normally gives a very short response or even ignores them - but she hears them. Growing up and being a part of YFC City Life has allowed her to



attend Vacation Bible Schools every summer as an elementary student. Since April she has been attending a weekly Wednesday night youth group with the Sayonara Center at a local church. This past month she has attended church on Sundays with one of the Sayonara staff. Growing up, one of her favorite parts of attending Vacation Bible School was the music and the dance team on stage. When she was younger she always talked about being a



part of that when she was older. Well - it finally happened! Jessica was able to volunteer with Summer Blast at Life Community Church while 17 Sayonara elementary students were participating in the VBS. She was on the dance team on stage and also helped with art. Through the six weeks of practicing the dances at church she become more
