YFC ENGAGES LOST TEENS IN CHRIST-SHARING RELATIONSHIPS

second semester at Whitney High School and Rocklin High School Campus Life Clubs. First, I've got to introduce you to one of my girls, Mae*. She's a sophomore this year, super driven, and just all-around awesome. Mae moved here from the Bay Area and used to be part of a church down there that had a huge impact on her faith. One thing she especially loved was a winter outreach project her church did every year, where they gave back to the community in a hands-on way. It stuck with her so much that she came to me and said, 'What if we did something like that here?'

I loved that she had the heart to bring that vision to life and that she cared enough to do something about it. So, we made it happen. In January, we hosted our first **Giving After Getting** event. Students were challenged to donate socks, and then we went downtown to hand them out to people experiencing homelessness in Sacramento.

Now, I'll be honest, some students joined in mainly to get community service hours for school. But God had other plans. As we were out there serving, you could literally see hearts shifting. Students who came for hours ended up walking away with a new perspective. That's the crazy thing about serving–God does something in us, not just through us. Mark 10: 45: 'For even the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.' I was (and still am) so proud of how the girls stepped up. It was beautiful and we're already talking about making it a yearly tradition!"



We're also starting to plan ahead for next school year, and one of the biggest things on my heart is launching a **student-led club**. I want our students to feel empowered to own it - to lead conversations, invite their friends, and create a space where Jesus is the center, even during a busy lunch break. It's still in the early stages, but I can already see God putting the right students in place. Pray that He continues to shape that vision and give us bold, humble student leaders who are ready to step up.

And one more thing: please keep praying for the students who are still figuring out what they believe-the ones who might not fully know Jesus yet, but who keep showing up anyway. Their curiosity is real. You can tell something's stirring, even if they're not ready to talk about it yet. I believe God is already working in their hearts-and I'm praying for moments of clarity, connection, and transformation."
